THE PUSHKIN STATE MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS


The Pushkin State Museum of Fine Arts has one of the largest collections of world art in Russia. It was founded in 1898 by Professor Ivan Tsvetaev and opened to the public on 31 May 1912 as The Alexander III Museum of Fine Arts. Today, the holdings of the museum contain around 700 000 artworks from Ancient Egypt and Greece to our day, including paintings, sculptures, works on paper, applied art, archaeological and numismatic artefacts, and photographs.


The permanent exposition in the Main Building comprises art from various countries spanning a period from Antiquity to the early 19th century. It includes an extensive collection of plaster casts of sculptures from Antiquity, the Middle Ages and the Renaissance as well as original paintings, sculptures, works on paper and applied arts. Of particular interest are the Ancient Egyptian collection; Priam's Treasure, discovered by Heinrich Schliemann at Troy; and works by leading European artists such as Botticelli, Rémbrandt, Rubens, Poussin and Watteau. The Main Building was designed by the architect Roman Klein at the turn of the 20th century. The Museum's interiors correspond to the historical era of the exhibited artworks, providing visitors with an immersive experience.

THE MUSEUM EXPOSITION CONTINUES IN THE GALLERY OF 19TH AND 20TH CENTURY EUROPEAN AND AMERICAN ART.

Tuesday, Wednesday from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m., last entry at 7 p.m.; Thursday, Friday from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m., last entry at 8 p.m.; Saturday, Sunday from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m., last entry at 7 p.m.; closed on Mondays.

Last admission and ticket sales 1 hour before closing; exhibition rooms begin to shut down 15 minutes before closing.


It is prohibited to:


- · Touch the exhibits;
